CAI Middle School courses are intentionally designed to provide rich opportunities for students to discover their talents and thrive emotionally, spiritually and academically before they transition into more rigorous options in the High School such as the Honors or dual credit courses.

All courses align with Indiana Academic Standards and are supported by the Christian Academy School System Biblical Worldview Standards.

Courses are based on 50 - min. daily classes, with the exception of English, which consists of two, 50-min classes each day.

Exploratory Class Schedules:
Students in grades 6-8 will select Band, Choir, or Art, (7th & 8th grade) as their primary elective and will have this class three days per week for the entire year. Computer, Spanish, PE, STEM or Art will be chosen as secondary electives and taken for one semester. Students may choose both Band and Choir as their primary electives and will have these classes on a 2 day/3 day per week rotating basis.
