The Indiana University Southeast School of Natural Resources has a Baccalaureate/ Doctor of Medicine Degree Scholarship that awards recipients 4 years of paid tuition plus on-campus housing costs. To be eligible, students must be Indiana residents admitted to IUS with a minimum SAT score of 1200, or composite RSAT score of 1290 on a single sitting, or an ACT composite score of 27 or higher and a GPA of at least 3.5.
